PLANT LIST

The Design Review Committee has reviewed the existing Plant List that has been used for a number of years. This list was compared to the lists of suggested plants, which are used by the Town of Oro Valley and by Pima County. Based on the Committee's review, a number of revisions were made to the CHCA List to incorporate the use of low water use/drought tolerant plants suitable for use in Cañada Hills.

The plants on the CHCA list can be grown in our area with moderate to no supplemental irrigation once established. For good appearance, supplemental irrigation may be applied during the growing season. All the plants can grow with less water than traditional high water use landscape plants, and the list provides a variety to accomplish any landscape design need.

Our Cañada Hills area is virtually all landscaped at this time. It is obvious that there is a great deal of landscaping existing that deviates from the revised List. There will be no attempt to bring existing landscaping into compliance with the plants on the List. This revised list is intended to assist homeowners in selecting appropriate plant material when making changes and/or additions to the existing landscaping. It is expected that all changes or additions will be in compliance if plant selections are made from this List.

There are several tables comprising the List. The first table "TABLE A" lists the plants by type then alphabetically by common name. The second table "TABLE B" lists the plants alphabetically by botanical name. The plants listed in both "TABLE A" and "TABLE B" are the same, just sorted differently. The List addresses the type of plant, common name, botanical name, water needs, seasonal color, hardiness, and whether it is allergenic, toxic, or invasive. The last table lists plants prohibited by the CHCA. Finally there is a listing of plants prohibited by the Town of Oro Valley.

Key to symbols:

WATER USE: (Approximate, depending on soil and climate conditions)

- 1 No supplemental irrigation once established
- 2 Irrigate once a month during the growing season once established
- 3 Irrigate twice a month during the growing season once established
- 4 irrigate once a week during the growing season once established

ALLERGENIC:

- a strong allergenic (all plants in this classification have been moved to the CHCA prohibited list)
- b moderately allergenic
- c weakly allergenic

TOXIC: May be harmful if eaten. Call AZ Poison Control Center at 626-6016

INVASIVE: May spread and intrude into natural and cultivated areas

SEASONAL COLOR: Showy flowers, fall color, or berries

HARDY:

- sh semi-hardy - some dieback in a hard frost
(t) Tender - severely damaged or killed in a hard frost
